Creativity & Problem Solving

- ▶ Pre-program activity: Students are required to read and complete the student workbook before attending the workshop. It includes worksheets, watching online videos, preparing questions for volunteers etc.
- Post-program activity: Students are required to complete the Personal Action Plan.
